TRANSPORT FOR ONE

efore Dean Kamen introduced the Segway Human Transporter in 2001, no one but the mysterious inventor knew that personal transportation would a big thing. Although the Segway, as it's popularly known, looks like a simple scooter, it was actually a huge leap in technology, being the first two-wheeled vehicle that could balance on its own. Fast forward to today, and there is a myriad of new personal transportation devices. As it stands, there are hoverboards everywhere, and devices like air wheels are starting to take the world by storm. So, what's in store for you to get around today - other than walking?



1. SEGWAY PT

There is no doubt that the Segway is most recognisable maker of personal transportation systems. The Segway PT is a battery-powered electric vehicle that can move you around on sidewalks, ramps, curbs and parks. The twowheeled. self-balancing vehicle has electric motors



that are powered by a battery that is chargeable at home. Its ability to balance itself is made possible by dual computers, two tilt sensors and gyroscopic sensors. The Segway PT can move at a top speed of 20 km/h and cover a distance of almost 40 kilometres before the battery dies out.











2. BOOSTED

Touted as the world's lightest electric vehicle, Boosted Longboard features twin brushless motors that add some charge to the battery. The vehicle's components are pretty similar to those of skates, and this is the reason it is commonly referred to as the Boosted Skateboard. Its top speed and range are 32 km/h and almost 10 km respectively. The advantage of the Boosted is that skaters already know how to use it.

3. HONDA

Resembling a stool, the Honda Uni-Cub is a personal transportation system that can be controlled by simple body movements such as leaning and shifting your body weight. For example, you need to lean or strafe left to move in that direction. Instead of walking, it's like sitting on a stool and simply leaning in the direction you wish to go. The device has a maximum speed of 6 km/h and mileage of 10 km.



4. ORBIT WHEELS

These devices combine the best features of skateboards and inline skates. To ride Orbit Wheels, on VOU need to make a wavelike body motion, and you can increase the speed by intensifying your motion. The electric Orbit Wheels batteries and can use cover a distance of about 2 kilometres at a fast walking pace that's more relaxed than other transport-for-one devices.







5. LEXUS HOVERBOARD

Unlike the so-called hoverboards that are currently invading shopping malls everywhere, the Lexus Hoverboard actually hovers an inch above the ground. Using magnetic levitation, the Lexus Hoverboard is truly a futuristic technology! It provides space-age frictionless movement resulting in extremely smooth rides. It achieves this by using an insulated core with high temperature superconducting blocks (HTSBs) and liquid nitrogen reservoirs to cool them. These parts are contained in cryostats that are installed above a track of permanent magnets. The current Lexus Hoverboard can attain a top speed of 100 km/h and cover a distance of 9 kilometres.

At those speeds and high prices, the Lexus Hoverboard is currently a strictly experimental technology at the moment. That said, this class of devices will definitely change the way we move about in our cities in the coming decade. The future sure looks less strenuous with these personal transportation devices!



e live in an increasingly fast-paced society. So, more important than ever to make sure that prepared for you're always any eventuality. Unusual, Interesting Historical

SPORTS

It's safe to say that you've seen a lot of football, tennis, basketball and golf on your television. There's nothing wrong with that – those are good, international sports. But do you sometimes wish for something a little different? If you do, then you're in luck. Here, we have brought together for you a list of strange and unusual sports with interesting histories that you may not have heard of before.



1. Oil Wrestling

Although oil wrestling is held in a few locales around the world, one of the oldest annual tournaments is held at the Kirkpinar

Oil Wrestling event held in Edirne, Turkey, in June every year. The wrestling match itself is part of a festival that dates back to 1357, in celebration of a battle of the Ottoman Empire. The match sees opponents pairs of pehlivan known as covered in olive oil, who have to try to wrestle each other into the ground. It's a display of strength and slippery technique. wrestling tournaments also traditionally take place in northern Greece, eastern Macedonia and western Thrace. In recent years, it has even made inroads into the Netherlands and Japan.





2. Bed Racing

The sport of bed racing was embraced and popularised by the people of the North Yorkshire town The Knaresborough. first race in 1965 was open only to military personnel from the Army and Navy as well as American Marines, but the competition is open to anyone today. The competitors race in teams of five, plus one on the bed. Each team must provide their own bed, which must be decorated in the theme for the year. The bed runs on four wheels, but also needs to be able to float. The 3-km race begins and ends at Conyngham Hall. About halfway through the run, the teams face a steep gradient climb to Castle Top hill before it's back down the slopes and toward the final challenge crossing a river.



3. Wife Carrying

Based on a Finnish legend from the 1800s, wife-carrying is a sport in which male competitors race while carrying a female teammate. Its modern incarnation began in Finland in 1992. Held in early July every year, the race requires a man to negotiate a 253.5-m course while carrying his "wife" on his back. The course includes various terrains and getting through dry land and waterbased obstacles. It's not just a challenge for the men, by the way, but it also requires great strength on the part of the women to hold on tight as the men try to make their way around the course as quickly as possible. The prize for the

winners is traditionally the woman's weight in beer! It is a strange race where having fun is one of the official rules.

4. Gurning

How about a competition where the ugliest face wins? Making faces is something children often do, but the World Gurning Contest is child's play! nothing like Gurning is a highly specialised where contestants pull increasingly ugly faces year after year. Gurning competitions originated in 1927 at the Egremont Crab Fair in the United Kingdom, ostensibly as an attraction to draw crowds to the Crab Fair. Since then, the annual ugly face contest has become a beautiful world-class. contest of serious silliness!

The next time you're bored with your usual sport, try making up your own competition. Who knows, you might start a new global tournament!



Ask а foreigner about Malaysia they'll and probably tell you that we're famous for our beaches and our food. And that's no accident - due to the mountainous interiors of our country, the main towns and cities tend to be based coastally, with economies that grew initially through trade and fishing. The river estuaries (so many kualakuala) and coastal waters produce an abundance of fresh and diverse seafood, which naturally formed a large part of the traditional diets. Malaysia is a paradise of cuisine, but let's look at some irresistible dishes that emerged from the sea.

Ikan Bakar

Literally "burned fish" in Malay, this barbecued dish is made of marinated fish and other seafood fired over charcoal. The meat is wrapped in bamboo leaves as protection from the flames and to seal in moisture. Garlic and onions are included, which become deliciously sweet and crispy when the seafood is done. Pick your choice of barbecued seafood then enjoy it with a side dish like "otak-otak".





Otak-Otak

Literally translated as "brains", otak-otak are SO named because early versions were grey and looked like brains. This delicacy is a combination of seafood, coconut, spices and sago flour that is grilled in a banana leaf to maintain moisture and add fragrance. Combined with grilled fish, it really will make your mouth water. Ikan bakar and otakotak are usually sold at Malay food stalls and restaurants.



Fish Head Curry

Coming from a southern Indian influence, fish head curry has a spicy and sour flavour over a coconut base. Often served in a clay pot, this dish is popular with visitors and the whole cross section of Malaysians. Usually, the whole head of a huge red snapper fish is slowly cooked along with eggplant, okra and amazing spices. With its long cooking time, the flesh of the fish head becomes very tender and falls off the bone. Going perfectly with hot, fluffy white rice, this is a real Malaysian comfort food that can commonly be found in Indian restaurants.







Chili Crab

Don't be selfish, but enjoy some succulent shellfish with chili crabs that can be had at Chinese seafood restaurants across the land. Mud crabs are the usual creatures used for this dish that is made perfect with a sweet and spicy, thick chili sauce. Don't worry about your taste buds, though, because the tomato-based sauce is usually just pleasingly spicy. You will get your fingers sticky, but that's part of the fun, and the taste makes everything worth it.




Oyster Omelette


Another dish with Chinese origins is the oyster omelette, which is made from oysters harvested from river estuaries, the same habitat where mud crabs can be found. The omelette can be ordered with or without spice, and it is a delicious specimen of umami flavour, that favourite of seafood lovers.

When in Malaysia, eat as Malaysians do. Chances are, even if you've lived in this country for years, you have your favourite cuisines. How about taking this article as a challenge to eat beyond your usual favourites? Take advantage of our rich heritage of extraordinary seafood-based dishes!





Verticutting is a process using a green mower fitted with thin, tightly spaced blades that cut vertically into the turf canopy. The depth of the blades is typically adjusted 1/64-inch to 1/8-inch (0.4 mm – 3.2 mm) below the effective cutting height. The blades may also dislodge a small amount of thatch but should not penetrate into the soil or turf root zone. The goal is to thin the turf canopy while maintaining a proper balance of leaf growth and turf density.



Vertical mowing is a maintenance practice periodically performed on greens to accomplish the following objectives:


- Remove excessive leaf growth that contributes to puffy, spongy surface conditions.
- Improve mowing quality and surface smoothness.
- Cut laterally growing stolons and promote an upright growth habit.
- Open grooves in the turf canopy for the incorporation of sand topdressing.

What happens if we don't do it?

An organic layer of thatch (which is the dead shoot, stem, and root organic material that accumulates between the soil surface and the green canopy) will tend to form. Grass growth will occur at the top of the canopy rather than at the true plant crown. As a result, the following conditions will compromise the health and growth of the plant:

- Root growth will diminish due to poor soil and gas exchange.
- Organic material will not properly decompose because of reduced microbial activity.
- The thatch layer will trap moisture, grass seed, fertilisers, pesticides and topdressing, preventing them from reaching the soil and roots.





The time taken for putting green surface recovery from verticutting is dependent upon a myriad of factors: type of grass or grasses present, weather forecast, fertility, the type of verticutting being done, etc., are necessary pieces of information for a specific answer. If regular light verticutting has been done, it should heal up in relatively short order. Actually, green speeds are typically slower for 1 to 2 days following the operation, and then they return to normal.

Verticutting is a cultural procedure that is best carried out lightly and frequently to obtain the best results.
